Programmes Offered

Our College offers nine Under Graduate courses and five Post Graduate courses. We have obtained sanction from the UGC to conduct two career oriented courses —one in the department of Botany and the other in the department of English. Besides these, every department offers short term add on certificate courses for the benefit of students.

Staff

At present the strength of the teaching staff is 55 and that of the Administrative Staff is 31. Though new courses like M.Sc. Zoology and B.Com have started during 2013-14 and 2014-15 respectively, posts have not been sanctioned. Shalini Rachel Varghese as heads of the departments of Physics, Economics and English, respectively. However, with deep sorrow we accept the retirement of four of our Professors—Smt. Beena Rachel Thomas, Smt. Elizabeth Varghese, Smt. Anna Kushy Jacob and Sri. Thomas P. Thomas, and three of our Administrative Staff—Sri.P.V.Cherian, St. T.T.Mariamma and Sri. Thomas Cherian, who have proved their efficiency in their own fields. Christian College family is deeply indebted to each one of them and we wish all of them a blissful and fruitful retired life.

Parent Teacher Association

The parent teacher association has always been a source of support for the college. Class wise PTS meeting are conducted once or twice during every semester to discuss the general conduct and academic performance of students. It is noteworthy that around 95% of parents turn up for these meetings. We are grateful to all parents, Mr. K. Thomas Mammen (President) and other committee members.

Alumni Association

The Executive Committee has met thrice during this academic year to discuss their plans to make the Golden Jubilee celebrations, a success. As usual, this year also, the alumni conducted light music, recitation, elocution competitions for students and gave away cash prizes to the winners. The Golden Jubilee Alumni Meet on 22 October 2015- Deepavali Day—was inaugurated by Mr.K.K.Balachandran I.P.S. The gathering felicitated three of the prominent alumni: Rev. Oommen Philip (Mar Thoma Sabha Secretary), Dr. B. Venugopal (Gastro-Enterologist, KIMS, Thiruvananthapuram), and Mr. Saji Thomas (United Nations). The alumni has been instrumental in getting the UNAI Chapter inaugurated in our college. Library

The college has a fully automated library that uses the software "Libsoft", with a collection of 29296 volumes including text books and bound periodicals. The library subscribes to 50 periodicals and 20 journals. The library offers Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) and also the bar code facility for easy detection and circulation of books. The library avails Inflibnet facility of UGC that gives access to more than 3000 e-journals and nearly 90000 books. This year's stock verification was done under the Chairmanship of Prof. Elizabeth Varghese. CCTV (with 8 cameras) facility is installed in the library with UGC support to watch and make sure that the facilities provided are properly being used by the stake holders.

The chief guest of the day was Mr. Saji Thomas from the Department of General Assembly and Conference Management, United Nations. He addressed the students on "Initiatives by Academic Institutions" on the same day. The Co-ordinator of the Chapter, Smt. Linchu Samuel of the Dept. of Economics, has successfully organised an essay writing competition on "Relevance of the Universal declaration of Human Rights" on 10 December 2014, the World Human Rights Day. A seminar was also organized for the benefit of students on that day when Dr. George K. Alex and Dr. Biju Thomas spoke at length on the need to promote human rights in different walks of life. On 23 March 2015 Sri. Anson Thomas, social activist and founder member of *Navajeevan*, Mumbai that rehabilitates women and children from the Red Streets of Mumbai enriched students with real life experiences.

Biji Abraham of the department of Economics, along with students took part in Save Varattar River Campaign to protest against encroachment and insensible developmental activities. The club members visited the social activists who were in dharna in Aranmula against the proposed Airport to express their solidarity and concern with those who fought against the wetlands and paddy fields that lead to and environmental biodiversity. On 23 September 2015 the Bio diversity club in collaboration with the Kerala Forest Department Social Extension Wing, Kollam, arranged the one day workshop on and "Medicinal Plants around us" and "Protection and conservation of Biodiversity for sustainable livelihood". The college has created a man made forest 'Shanthisthal' to create an artificial grove of rare, endangered species of plants. There are 71 varieties of plants in this area. The club in association with N. S. S. Units has installed a bio gas plant to show the management of organic waste. "Wetland on Wheels" a mobile exhibition supported by MoEF was organized by the Environment Research Centre of Ashoka Trust for Research in Ecology and the Environment in the campus on 15 January 2015 it explained the need to conserve local Wetlands and Bio-cultural Diversity. The club conducted the campaign against Pampa- Achen Kovil - Vaippar river inter-linking proposed by the NWDA. The Club in college in association with 'Thanal' an NGO based at Thiruvananthapuram has jointly conducted campaigns against Genetically Modified (GM) crops and the convenor of the club participated in the

parliament march held at Jandar Mandir, New Delhi. The volunteers of ELA club expressed their solidarity with Adivasis and Dalits in their struggle for land on 14 December 2014. They were fortunate enough to share a day with Medha Patkar who came to Thiruvananthapuram to empathise with the adivasis who were conducting satyagraha before the Government Secretariat. On 15 December 2015 an exhibition of terracotta jewelry was arranged in college to support the indigenous community from Raichur in Karnataka as part of their living and rehabilitation.

Nature Club

The club under the guidance of Dr. Rajan David, Department of Hindi, organized nature camps for members of the club at Nelliampathy from 13 December to 15 December 2014, and at Pampadumchola— the smallest National Park in Kerala—from January 10 to 12, 2015 to make them aware of the necessity conserving nature. Trekking and bird watching were arranged for students with the cooperation of Mr. Ranjith, the Forest Range Officer. The one day seminar on Elephants, 'Aana . . . Needy students meet the counselors during the noon interval in the counseling centre, which is attached to the meditation centre.
