SAVE VARATTAR CAMPAIGN (NSS)

The Varattar originates from the Pampa at Edanadu, near Chengannur, and meanders through Puthukulangara, Meppuram, Thalayar and Nannad before it empties into the Manimala at Eramallikkara in Alappuzha district. The nine-km-long river, once a major source of freshwater all through the year, is now almost dead barring a few water pools here and there. The fall in water level in the Pampa and the Manimala and accumulation of silt on the riverbed are said to be the reasons for the drying up of the river. Even the wells in the vicinity turn dry, leaving the 12.5 sq km Varattar river basin water-scarce during summer.

As part of the Save Varattar Campaign initiated by MalayalaManorama, five NSS volunteersjoined a team of 30 selected students from various colleges on 08-11-2013.NSS Program officer Sri.Biji Abraham also accompanied the students. They walked up to the place where Varattar begins- a sand bank with overgrown grass was seen blocking the entrance. Walking along Varattar, they could see overgrowth of grass, bushes and trees and other encroachments. The students reported that, large-scale encroachment of the riverbed is a serious problem facing the Varattar. Local people cultivate tapioca, rice and vegetables on the heavily silted riverbed. They pointed out that, Varattar's rejuvenation will boost the production of rice and other cash crops and solve the drinking water scarcity.

OBSERVANCE OF WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY(BHOOMITHRASENA CLUB)

World Environment Day 2014 Celebration organized by Bhoomithrasena Club, Christian College, Chengannur and supported by Kerala State Council for Science, Technology and Environment (KSCSTE) was held from 4th June, 2014 to 6th June 2014. A detailed report and some photos of the events are attached.

Day - 1

As a curtain raiser to the three day celebration, a Green Cricket Carnival was held on the opening day. The team Royal greens represented by the members of teaching and non-teaching staff played an eight over match with Green warriors - the team represented by student members of the college. Tossing was done using a Ficus leaf. Team Green warriors won the toss and elected to bat. They scored 112 runs with the loss of 4 wicket in 8 overs. During the drinks break, green mango juice and banana were served to the players. In reply, the Royal greens could score only 67 runs with the loss of 6 wickets in 8 overs. The prize distribution of the Green Cricket Carnival was unique in that, the runner up - Royal green team was awarded with the sapling of an allspice plant (*Pimentadioica*) in a small green pot and a small bowl of green fruits containing Watermelon, Robusta Plantain. The winning team, the Green warriors got a Myristica plant (*Myristicafragrans*) sapling in a large green pot and a large bowl of green fruits. The honourable Principal of the College, Dr. Achamma Alex and Physical Education teacher, Ms. Ruby Mathew distributed the prizes and the teams planted the saplings on the side of the Cricket Stadium.

A green documentary film festival was also held on the same day. Five documentaries on Environment and conservation namely "Don't buy trouble", "Truth About Tigers", "Water thief", "Sprays of Misery" and "We are your Friends' – Bats", were screened for the students.

Day - 2

As part of the Harithasree tree planting project of Government of Kerala, the student members of Bhoomithrasena Club, National Service Scheme and Nature Club Planted 512 saplings between 10 am & 11 am. A preliminary meeting of the staff and students in this connection was held on 3rd June, 2014. Thirty eight teams consisting of five students, one teaching staff and one non teaching staff were selected for the planting of trees in the courtyard of nearby houses. Another two teams, one with twenty students for planting inside the campus and one with five students for Spread the shade – a roadside plantation programme were also selected. It was decided to provide a vehicle to the members assigned with Spread the Shade programme, for transportation of the saplings.

On 5th June morning, the students assembled in front of the College. Ten saplings each in a carry bag were supplied to the teams deputed for planting outside the Campus. The saplings supplied by the Social forestry wing, Alappuzha, included Emblica, Sandal, Mahogany, Rambutan, Anona, Neem, Rosewood, Psidium etc. A green Certificate of appreciation for the family which co-operate with the planting programme was also issued to the team captain. With the support of the family members of residences situated within a circumference of 3 km. From the college, students planted 380(Three hundred and eighty)

plants. Fifty five (55) saplings were planted at the College Campus and 77 (Seventy Seven) saplings were planted along road side with the help of autorickshaw drivers of Alappuzha and Pathanamthitta districts. Altogether, 512 (Five hundred and twelve) saplings were planted on 5th June, 2014 between 10 am & 11 am through Harithasree tree planting campaign. All the team members returned to the college at 12.30 pm and they were provided with refreshments.

The feedback from the public with regard to Harithasreeprogramme was very impressive. The successful conduct of the programme was mainly due to the co-operation from the staff of the College and the dedicated work of the student volunteers of Bhoomithrasena Club, National Service Scheme & Nature club. More over the support and co-operation from the part of the public was highly appreciable.

A Colouring competition for Kindergarten Students on the theme 'Nature' was conducted on the same day. Thirty six students participated in the programme. For high school Students, on elocution programme titled 'Raise your Green Voice Contest' was arranged, in which the participant was allowed to raise his / her green voice for nature in just two minutes. Twenty two students participated in the programme.


<u>Day – 3</u>



WORLD WILDLIFE DAY CELEBRATION 2014(BHOOMITHRASENA CLUB)

As part of World Wildlife day 2014 celebration, A STUDY ON THE ODONATE (Dragon Fly and Damsel fly) DIVERSITY OF A WETLAND HABITAT IN ARANMULA REGION was undertaken by the Bhoomithrasena club. The details of the study are appended below.

Wetlands around the Aranmula village in Pattanamthitta district of Kerala encompass 3500 acres of freshwater wetlands and paddy fields in the floodplains of the Pambariver. These biodiversity-rich wetlands are the major source of water for the villages of Aranmula, Mallappuzhassery and Kidangannur, and serve as natural flood breaks when the Pamba River overflows. Many odonates can be seen associated with wetland ecosystems in different parts of Kerala. It was in this circumstance that a study on the diversity of odonates of a wetland system in Aranmula region was undertaken.

A workshop on the diversity and conservation strategies of Odonates was arranged for the students on 29/01/2014. Dr. Abraham Samuel, an expert in the field of Odonate Diversity led the session. The odonate diversity of Kerala, survey techniques and the conservation strategies of odonates were discussed in the workshop.

The study was conducted in a wetland area close to the proposed private airport project at Aranmula. The area is located at 9° 19' 60 North latitude & 76° 40' 60 Eastlongitudes. A tributary of Kozhithodu, which is flowing close to Thettikkavu, a sacred grove closely associated with SreeParthasarathy Temple at Aranmula was selected for the study.

A survey of odonates was carried out along the stream on the first week of February. Transect method was followed to observe and record the odonates on the 1 Km stretch of the stream. The survey was started at 2 pm and lasted for 3 hrs. Visual encounter survey (Heyeret al.) was used to study odonates. Most of the species were photographed and identified in their natural habitat, but in few cases when it was difficult to assess, then specimens were captured for their further identification and after that they were released in their natural habitat.


